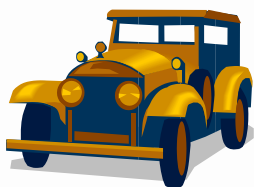


In Washington County, over 300 of our veterans find themselves without a roof over their head each night. To raise awareness for this national and community issue, Cornell Estates is hosting

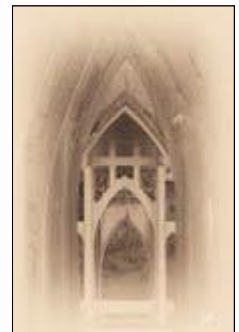

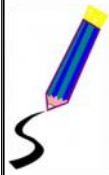
